For the third year, the City of Oroville proudly is the major sponsor of the 5K River-Run ... This year the event has been moved out to the fabulous Oroville North Forebay Recreation Area off Highway 70 at Garden Drive. The course will feature great vistas of water, wildflowers, livestock and rolling green meadows. This year the benefactor of the proceeds from the 5K is the Oroville YMCA which is celebrating their 100th year of community service to the Oroville Community! Besides the 5K, the annual "YMCA Fun-N-Fitness" day will be going on during and after the 5K. The event features a variety of activities including: water games, kayaking, fishing simulator, obstacle course, crafts, animals to pet and much more.





Wendell P. Hammon (1854—1938) was honored posthumously at the annual OEDCO Awards & State of the City event recently held at the Southside Community Center. Mr. Hammon received the Sam Norris Award for Excellence which over the past ten years has been awarded to individuals that have made a significant contribution to the Oroville Community. Mr. Hammon, an entrepreneur, was involved in many enterprises including orange & olive orchards. A quote from the History

of Butte County best states Mr. Hammons attributes, "His name is almost a household word in California, where he is known as a builder of electric railroads and a leader in the development of hydroelectric power projects, as well as the world's most prominent dredge-mining operator." Mr. Hammon's family generously donated a bucket from one of the dredge-mining machines which is prominently displayed at the Montgomery Street — Highway 70 intersection. See the tribute at:
