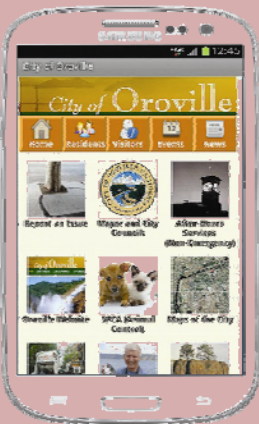

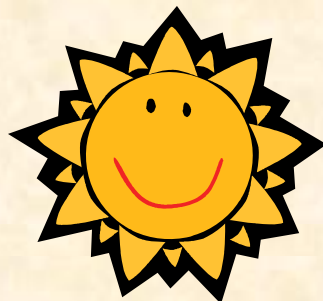

VISIT A MUSEUM:

While you won't find any dinosaurs, you will find local museums that feature antique tools, pioneer history, Chinese artifacts, a Victorian home in a beautiful park, the home that olives built, an interesting Nature Center and the Lantrip Ashtray Collection!



HIKE THE TRAILS:

One step at a time will take you to over 74 miles of great trails that follow the Feather River, another that meanders through Riverbend Park, one that takes you past incredible lake vistas, and a great trail to Feather Falls. You can hike, bike, or ride a horse.



ENJOY THE LAKE:

Endless possibilities await you at beautiful Lake Oroville. Boat, swim, hike, ride your horse, or just gaze at the majesty of the lake and the surrounding area. Stop by the Visitors Center for interesting displays.

PICNIC AT THE PARKS:

With over 20 parks, it's hard to imagine that you can't find that one special place for a great picnic. On the 4th of July the Oroville Dam comes alive with an incredible fireworks show. Music in Riverbend Park is on Thursdays nights starting at 6:30 P.M. Play bocce ball at Hewitt Park after your picnic.



ENJOY THE FEATHER RIVER:

Drop a kayak in the river, skip a stone, watch the rapids, visit the Fish Hatchery, and see the fish ladder in action. Or take a ride up Highway 70, following the Feather River and marvel at the landscape and interesting historic bridges.



FAMILY FISHING:

With over 40 varieties of fish in Lake Oroville and the Feather River there has to be one that you might want to catch. Better yet, make it a family adventure. A fishing license is required for those over 16 years old. Don't forget to wear sun-block, bring bug spray, beverages and snacks.



WATER SAFETY:

Prevention and common sense can help prevent water-related accidents. Take a swimming class at the local YMCA, and always have life jackets available when on the lake or river. To learn more about water safety, visit the Red Cross at www.redcross.org



FIRE SAFETY:

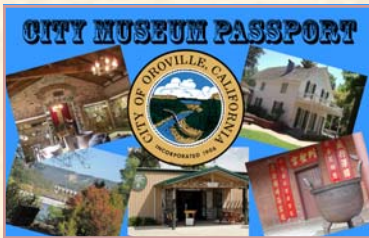

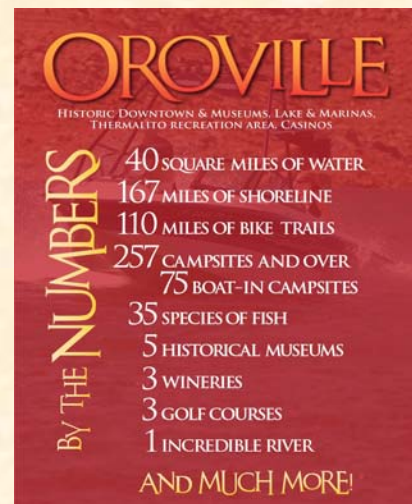
