

A wildflower is a flower that grows in the wild, meaning it was not intentionally seeded or planted. Trying to predict the California wildflower season seems to be an almost futile task, with the final result depending on rainfall, temperature, wind and a host of other factors

On Saturday, April 2nd the Feather River Recreation & Park District is hosting the annual Wildflower & Nature Festival at Riverbend Park (Montgomery Street & Highway 70). The event

starts at 10:00 A.M. and runs until 4:00 P.M. Lots

of flower related activities and displays, food, entertainment, kids activities, special presentations by the Lake Oroville Visitors Center and a shuttle bus up to the Table Mountain Flower Fields. There will also be an informational booth hosted by the City of Oroville that will have displays featuring the City Museums & Passports and the Municipal Law Enforcement Officers program.










