The return of the Salmon Sculptures!



The beautiful metal salmon sculptures that local artist Steve Nielsen did for the Montgomery Street & Hwy 70 underpass have now found a permanent and prominent home!

Six of the sculptures had been removed by the City in



March 2015 after one of them was stolen. They were part of the California Department of Transportation Landscape Improvement Grant that the City had received in 2011 as part of improvements to the entry to the City. A series of meetings with the artist and representatives of the City and City Council provided the recommendation and approval to have them installed at the front of the Municipal

Auditorium.

Local artist, Ted Hanson owner of Brushstrokes Gallery stepped forward and volunteered to paint an artistic background reminiscent of waves that will help showcase the sculptures. Additionally they will have LED lighting from dusk until dawn.


The re-installed salmon made their debut just before this years Salmon Festival.






