

LOCATION



Situated along the banks of the Feather River, Oroville is the gateway to the Lake Oroville State Recreation Area. With history dating back to the California Gold Rush when thousands came to the area hoping to strike it rich with gold, Oroville has a strong and storied past.

Today Oroville continues to grow with recreation and agritourism abound. With the second largest lake in California right in its backyard, wineries and small farms nestled in the East Oroville Foothills, and stately Victorians that line the downtown streets, Oroville offers small-town charm with large opportunities.

The Historic Downtown Oroville is seeing new investment from local business owners. Home to boutique stores and restaurants, Downtown Oroville is the heart of the community located just steps away from the Feather River.

Situated off of State Routes 70 and 99 which offers convenient access to Sacramento and connects the City to Interstate 5, Oroville is situated at a strategic location that allows for easy travel to neighboring Chico and nearby Sacramento, San Francisco, and Silicon Valley while maintaining an affordable cost of living and business.

Airports

Oroville is home to the Oroville Municipal Airport, which offers easy access for general aviation and business aircraft. Runway 02-20 is 6,020 ft long and Runway 13-31 is 3,540 ft long.

Chico Municipal Airport, located 25 miles north of Oroville, has regular FedEx and UPS cargo flights.

Sacramento International Airport (SMF) is 60 miles south of Oroville and is the gateway to Northern California.

Rail Service

Union Pacific runs right through Oroville and the industrial park along the Feather River Route.

Passenger service is provided by Amtrakin Chico

The Oroville community is known for being friendly, community-oriented, and pro-business. The City continues to see new developments, from market-rate and affordable housing to retail and hospitality. New additions to the City include the first Maverik fueling station in California and a new 4-story Hampton Inn and Suites. Many retailers and manufacturers have found success in Oroville, and yours can too!

Oroville has a diverse economy ranging from tourism and retail to manufacturing and government.

More than \$12 million in sales tax revenue was collected in 2020 and over \$28.6 million in building permits were issued in Q4 2020.



Enjoy the Outdoors

With acres of parklands, waterways, and wildlife refuges, Oroville is rich with recreation opportunities. Riverbend Park, one of the community's most popular parks, is right on the banks of the Feather River and offers everything: a beach to cool off on hot summer days, a boat launch to explore the river, and soccer fields that play host to youth soccer leagues. The Lake **Oroville State Recreation** Area offers miles of shoreline to explore and wooded acres for camping, hiking, and equestrian riding. Special events like the Salmon Festival and Feather Fiesta Days draws thousands to the area to see what Oroville has to offer.


