



SENATE BILL 1383 ENFORCEMENT & VIOLATIONS

Senate Bill 1383 requires jurisdictions to annually inspect businesses to assure they are separating garbage, recycling, and compost correctly and providing the required on-site training and signage. Enforcement of these rules begins in 2024.

Warnings (a "Notice of Violation") are given before a citation is issued. Fines range from \$50-\$500. If you receive a letter, contact Recology or the City of Oroville to correct your violation and prevent future fines.

Avoid missed pickups by reviewing your business and multi-family residential programs regularly and following the program check lists below.

Set up your disposal area for success:

- Place compost & recycling containers next to each landfill container both inside and outside.
- Ensure containers have proper labels and additional signage is near the containers.
- Maintain a clean and tidy waste area, and ensure containers are not damaged.
- If you are not yet subscribed to compost or recycling service, call Recology at 530.533.4783 to start services.*

**Sites with minimal amounts of food scraps, compostable paper, and plant waste may qualify for a compost service waiver.*



Make it easy to compost & recycle:

- All recycling and compost carts are clearly labeled.
- There is signage about accepted materials in the recycling and compost visible from the containers.
- All employees and tenants have received compost & recycling information in the past 12 months.
- Customers, employees, tenants, and contractors have access to properly labeled recycling, garbage, and compost containers.
- Containers are periodically inspected for contamination, and customers, employees, and tenants are regularly reminded of proper sorting procedures.

Recycling tips:

Keep the following tips in mind to keep costs down and reduce contamination throughout the year.

- Make sure all your employees, customers, tenants and contractors know how to properly separate materials.
- Recyclables need to be empty, clean, and dry to be recycled.
- Do not bag recyclables or compost. Bags are a contaminant in both recycling and compost containers.
- Focus on waste prevention, which helps eliminate waste at the source. This saves natural resources and energy and cuts cost.

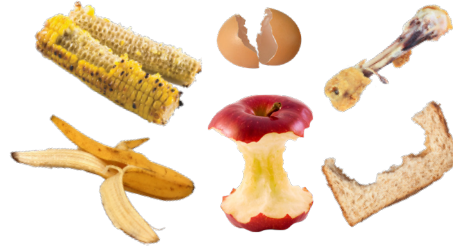

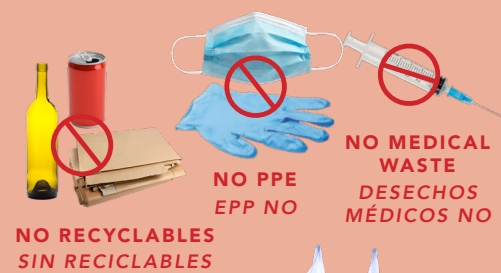

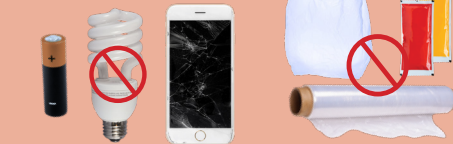
