# NEW FIRE PERMIT FEES EFFECTIVE JANUARY 6, 2009

The Oroville City Council adopted Resolution 7221 at the November 4, 2008 Council meeting. This resolution adopted fees associated to State required Fire permits. These fees become effective 60 days after adoption.

Attached is the new fee schedule.

Section A pertains to permits required for construction projects.

Fire permits for construction must be obtained prior to the issuance of the Building Permit unless approved by the Oroville Fire Department.

Section B pertains to Annual or Operational Fire Permits.

The State Fire Code requires businesses that involve large numbers of occupants, handle hazardous materials or temporary installations to obtain a permit to operate. A business must renew the permit on an annual basis. See the attached list of businesses requiring annual permits.

Section C pertains to miscellaneous permits.

These fees contained in this section pertain mostly to cost recovery for services performed by the Fire Department.

\*The annual permits for an occupancy inspections (Group R,E,A,I and H occupancy permits) includes inspection of typical functions associated with the occupancy group, (i.e. an H occupancy annual permit for an Auto Body Shop will include inspection of welding and storage of flammable liquids) and are not required to obtain additional permits. Business that require multiple annual permits which are not related to an annual occupancy permit will be charged full fees for the highest permit and additional permits will be reduced by 33% (i.e. A Lumber mill would possibly require an annual permit for Lumber yard, High-pile storage, and Hazardous material storage. Using this example, three annual permits would be issued. Each permit fee is \$202. A reduction of 33% (\$67) is given on the 2nd and 3rd permit.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Typical annual events that qualify for an annual permit for Carnivals, circus, fair classification: Salmon Festival, Old Time Fiddlers Festival, Carnivals -Midway of Fun, Parades, Craft Fairs. Feather Fiesta Days, Art Festivals, Gold Rush Car Show, Chili Feed, etc.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE OROVILLE CITY COUNCIL REVISING THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FEES WITHIN THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR CITY SERVICES

WHEREAS, the City of Oroville has conducted an extensive and exhaustive analysis of the City's Fire Department services, the cost associated with the services rendered by the City, the beneficiaries of the services provided and the revenues derived from those paying the fees and charges for such services, rendered; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Sections 66016 and 66018, et seq., specific fees charged for City services must be adopted by the City Council by resolution, after providing notice and holding a public hearing; and

WHEREAS, notice of public hearing has been provided pursuant to Government Code section 6062 (a) for the proposed resolution relating to such fees and the required public hearing held on September 2, 2008.

WHEREAS, a schedule of fees and charges to be paid for such Fire Department services needs to be adopted so that the City may effectuate its policies; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has reviewed the proposed schedule of fees and charges based on the City's budgeted and projected costs reasonably borne for the fiscal year 2008/09.

WHEREAS, all requirements of California Government Code Sections 66016 and 66018 are hereby found to have been followed by the City.

NOW THEREFORE, the Oroville City Council resolves as follows:

**SECTION 1. FEE SCHEDULE ADOPTION.** The fees and charges attached as Exhibit "A" are hereby adopted and shall be used and applied by the various City department in computing City fees for the City Fire Department services as listed in Exhibit "A".

<u>SECTION 2. SEPARTATE FEE FOR EACH PROCESS.</u> All fees set by this resolution are for each identified service. Additional City service fees shall be required for additional services or activities that are not covered by this resolution. Where fees are indicated on per unit of measurement basis, the fee is for each identified unit or portion there of within the indicated ranges of such units.

**SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This resolution shall take effect 60 days from its adoption.
