The Oroville City Council and Redevelopment Agency approved a request to partner with Butte County providing \$120,000 as matching funds to a Housing and Urban Development (HUD) grant that will be used to construct a retaining wall which is a viable part of this long envisioned project. The City of Oroville and the Redevelopment Agency have previously provided support to this project totaling \$341,172.73.

The **retaining wall** provides the base for a peaceful landscape area memorializing our area Veterans. A shade structure, flagpoles, planters, granite benches, a war monument and a Wall of Honor compliment the Memorial Park which is located at 2440 Montgomery Street. The park will have vistas of the beautiful Feather River, off-street parking, be ADA compliant, and will have access to the existing Veterans Memorial Building.




