#### SUMMARY

The Successor Agency will consider amending the Enforcement Obligation Payment Schedule and approving the draft Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On December 29, 2011, the Court upheld ABX1 26, the Dissolution Act, which as of February 1, 2012; all redevelopment agencies in California were dissolved.

On January 9, 2012, staff presented and the Council voted on various actions and recommendations to prepare for the dissolution of the Redevelopment Agency.

At the January 30, 2012, Joint City Council/Redevelopment Agency meeting, the City Council adopted an amendment to the Enforceable Obligations Payment Schedule (EOPS). As the City is the Successor Agency to the former Redevelopment Agency, the Successor Agency can only make payments required pursuant to an EOPS until a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) becomes operative. The EOPS may be amended by the Successor Agency prior to the formation of the Oversight Board.

#### **DISCUSSION**

#### ENFORCEMENT OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE (EOPS)

Staff is requesting that the Successor Agency consider amending the EOPS. Since the January 30, 2012, City Council meeting and the approval of the first amendment to the EOPS, staff has made material changes to the schedule to more accurately reflect administrative costs associated with the winding-down of the Oroville Redevelopment Agency.

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Such changes to the EOPS include:

- Updating the Successor Agency Administrative Overhead
- Updating the Successor Agency Operational Staffing Costs
- Asset Disposition (funding set-aside for appraisal services)
- o Grant Match

### RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE (ROPS)

Staff is requesting that the Successor Agency consider approving the <u>draft</u> Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS). It is called a draft until the Oversight Board approves it. [NOTE: By that time, it is anticipated that the audit by the County Auditor-Controller's Office will be completed].

The ROPS is virtually identical to the EOPS, except that it is the document that will need to be approved by the Successor Agency Oversight Board. Upon approval by the Oversight Board, the ROPS will be the governing document in which tax increment will be allocated to fulfill the legal obligations on the ROPS on a six-month basis. The Successor Agency will prepare a new ROPS every six months for Oversight Board approval.

This initial draft ROPS will cover February 1 – June 30. The EOPS will continue to be your operative payment schedule until the ROPS takes effect May 1,  $\underline{if}$  it is approved by the oversight board and sent to the DOF/SCO by April 15. So in reality, it functionally addresses May 1 – June 30.

**Property Tax Allocation 1** – Based on ROPS, the County Auditor-Controller is scheduled to make its first allocation of property taxes to your Redevelopment Obligation Retirement Fund on May 16<sup>th</sup> to cover the months of May and June.

Staff will have to come back to the Successor Agency and Oversight Board with the second ROPS to cover July 1 – December 31. Based on that second ROPS, the County Auditor-Controller is scheduled to make its second allocation of property taxes to your Redevelopment Obligation Retirement Fund on June 1<sup>st</sup> to cover the months of July through December. From then on, the allocations will always be January and June.

- **Section 2.** Approval of EOPS and Draft ROPS. The Oroville Successor Agency hereby approves and adopts the amended Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule pursuant to AB 1X 26 (see Exhibit "A") and the draft Recognized Obligation payment Schedule (see Exhibit "B").
- Section 3. <u>Posting; Transmittal to Appropriate Agencies.</u> The Executive Director is hereby authorized and directed to fulfill all necessary public notifications for the amended EOPS and draft ROPS in accordance with AB 1X 26. The Executive Director is further authorized and directed to transmit, by mail or electronic means, to the Butte County Auditor-Controller, the state Controller and the California Department of Finance such notification as required by AB 1X 26.
  - **Section 4.** The Secretary shall adopt to the adoption of this Resolution.
