## **INAUGURAL 5K RIVER RUN**



On Saturday, May 19, 2012 the City of Oroville co-sponsored a 5K runwalk as part of the celebration of the opening of Oroville's Downtown Farmers Market. The Market, a downtown tradition for many years has selected a "healthy living" theme for this year providing an incredible selection of fruit, vegetables and other delectable local products.

Mooretown Rancheria/Feather Falls Casino and Gold Country Casino pledged funds to be used for purchasing fresh local produce that will benefit Oroville's Middle Schools. Mayor Linda Dahlmeier stated, "We are appreciative of the commitment made by both local casinos which will allow the schools to promote healthy living to the students." Mayor Dahlmeier went on to say, "There is a powerful relationship between childhood obesity and lifelong weight and related medical problems. Exercise along with a balanced diet provides the foundation for a healthy, active life. One of the most important things parents can do is encourage healthy habits in their children early on in life. It is not too late to start."

**The 5K run/walk** was 3.1 miles and the participants started at the Historic State Theatre, meandered along downtown streets, moved past the Farmers Market at Myers & Montgomery Streets, headed up to the levee to Centennial Plaza and down to the beautiful Feather River overlook trail into Bedrock Park and turned on Montgomery Street running and walking past graceful historical homes and stunning trees to the finish line at Montgomery & Myers Streets.

The inaugural event brought close to 200 participants who all received commemorative shirts, participant ribbons and medals that were awarded in age categories. The Downtown Farmers Market also provided three delectable baskets of fresh produce and other local goodies. The City plans to make this an annual event that will coincide with the opening of the Downtown Farmers Market. The event had a net profit of \$1900.00 which the Oroville City Council awarded to *The Hope Center* a local group that benefits the homeless and underserved residents of Oroville.

Tickets are \$10.00 in advance and are available at the restaurant and the Oroville Area Chamber of Commerce or \$15.00 at the door.




