B-1	City of Oroville Loan- This was the only Item that DOF requested to be removed from the ROPS. This item was on the EOPS and paid before the first ROPS existed. The Oroville City Council Approved the Transfer of funds on March 2, 2011, prior to the dissolution of RDA on February 1, 2012.
D-6	Oroville Inn Code Enforcement Legal Services - This legal matter related to the Oroville Inn has experienced protracted litigation related to a property owner who failed and refused to upkeep the property to comply with the City codes. The owner has challenged the ability of the City to declare the property a public nuisance, which is not a factor in most code enforcement cases. As a result, the litigation has been more costly than initially anticipated.
D-8	Skipper Clark Landscaping Services - This obligation, formally listed on ROPS 2 as line item D-6, did not have a numerical amount listed as an obligation. However, this account currently expends approximately \$330.00/Month for landscaping services of Successor Agency Properties and is under contact until February 2, 2013. The estimated amount on ROPS 2 for the six-month Obligation should have been \$1,980.00.
D-9	Contract with G. Harold Duffey - Mr. Duffey resigned from his position with the City of Oroville on Wednesday, July 11, 2012 and relinquished his contract with the City of Oroville. The Actual expenditures exceed the estimated costs because the contract ender prematurely; Mr. Duffey was paid his salary and accrued benefits.
	Successor Agency Legal Services - Legal fees related to the elimination of the RDA has been more extensive than initially anticipated as a result of modifications by the legislature and the specific circumstances presented with the Oroville RDA. In addition, various questions have arisen related to the Department of Finance and the Oversight Board that required additional research which was not anticipated when the estimate was created. As a result, the legal fees have been higher than previously contemplated.
