

The Oroville 5K River Run which was held on Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, to benefit the Oroville Police Officers Association "Shoes for Kids" program was not only a fun and healthy event, but a successful event for all who attended.

The local "Shoes for Kids" program has been coordinated, on a volunteer basis, by the Oroville Police Officers Association since 2001 providing over 3600 pairs of shoes and 21,000 pairs of socks to children in the Oroville community. Oroville's program is part of the "Shoes that Fit" program which is a national organization that started in 1992 in Claremont, CA. The national program operates through an impressive network of volunteer-run local grassroots chapters with no government funding and 100% of community donations going directly to benefit school children.

Participants and spectators enjoyed the finish line festivities held at Centennial Plaza with music provided by the Old Time Fiddlers. Interesting and informative displays by, Nelsons Footwear, Oroville Hospital, Oroville Sports Club, California Water Company, Core Fitness Plus, The Lords Gym, and Feather River Recreation and Park District. #### **Aseptic Containers**

Juice boxes

Milk cartons

#### Glass

All colors of glass beverage and food containers (Please rinse and remove lids)

#### Metal

(All metal food and beverage containers, including those made of aluminum, tin, steel and bi-metals: Aluminum cans (Soda cans, beer cans, etc.))
Pots and pans

Tin/steel food and beverage cans (Please rinse - Labels are okay)

#### **Paper**

Most clean and dry household paper:

Cardboard (Flatten and bundle with string no larger than 3'x3')

Computer paper

**Envelopes (Including plastic window types)** 

Food boxes (cereal, crackers)

Junk mail and catalogs

Magazines and phone books

Newspaper

#### **Plastic**

All rigid containers with recycling symbols 1-7, and other materials including: Milk and juice jugs

Shampoo, detergent, and other household bottles (Please rinse and remove lids)

Soft drink and water bottles

Yogurt, margarine, and other food containers



## RECYCLING TRIVIA

- The amount of aluminum currently recycled in one year is enough to rebuild the entire commercial fleet every six months!
- 26% to 41% of the 2.4 million tons of PET plastic discarded each year is bottled water bottles!
- If we recycled all of our aluminum cans for one year, we could save enough energy to light Washington, D.C. for 3.7 years!
